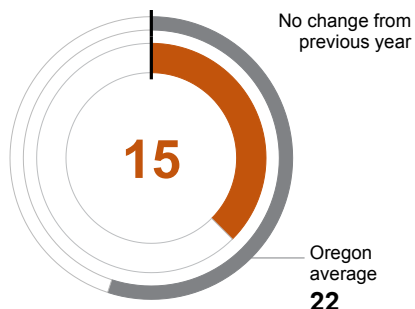

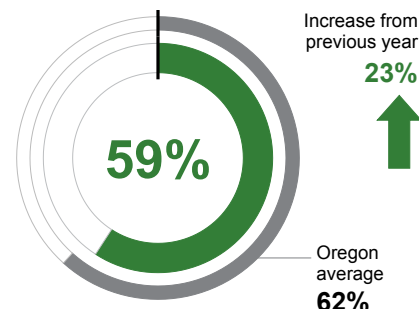
CLASS SIZE

REGULAR ATTENDERS

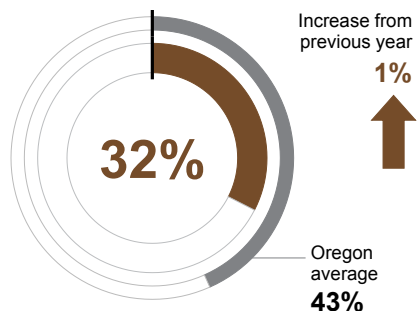
Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.

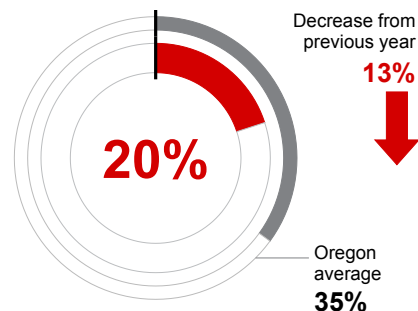
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



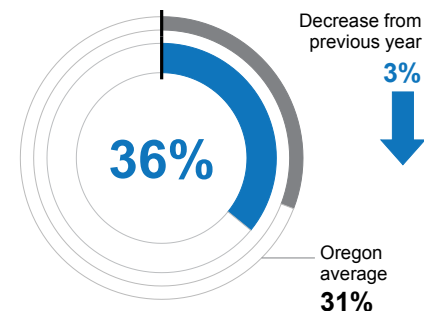
MATHEMATICS

School Goals

We continue to provide a high quality education in Language Arts, Mathematics, and Science. Teachers focus on specific small groups and whole class instruction. Critical thinking is a focus in all curriculum areas. Each student receives a Personalized Education Plan, focusing on the students' strengths and areas for improvement. We incorporate Art, Music, PE, and Technology into our daily instruction. Students are instructed by both a teacher and teaching assistant in each classroom. A holistic approach to student education is utilized at Sunny Wolf Charter School.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2027. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

Safe & Welcoming Environment

We believe in fostering the whole child. We provide an environment that encourages students to be successful. Students learn to manage conflicts through Second Step lessons and by using Kelso's Choice. No cost breakfast and lunch are provided for all students. Safety for our students is our highest priority. The front door to the school is locked and visitors must ring a bell to enter the building. Safety plans and procedures are in place. Due to our small school size, all staff and students know each other. This makes the atmosphere feel like a family.
